Covid-19 Impacts to Camp Leo

While many things still seem very uncertain, we know many Lions are also interested to know the latest information on Camp Leo's programs for children and families impacted by Type 1 diabetes. Our planning committees have been working diligently on our upcoming summer and fall programming, so we're prepared no matter how the next few months unfold.

While we are unable to do our traditional camp sessions this summer, we are working on a couple of alternate programs that we hope will bring a little "Camp Leo Magic" to our campers over the next few months.

First, we are mailing a "Camp Leo Misses You" box to all of our campers. The box will include a Camp Leo t-shirt, iconic camp snacks, activities to do at home, and more, to bring our community closer together while still at home. We are mailing out about 300 boxes to all our campers (at no charge) as a way to bring a little bit of Leo to all of our campers this year, no matter their financial circumstances.

Second, we are planning a series of virtual camp sessions, called "Leo at Home", for July and August. Just like at our traditional summer camp sessions, campers will be assigned cabin groups and counselors. We will spend some time together online weekly, playing games, making connections with friends, and spending time in community with others living with type 1 diabetes.

We hope these programs will help us provide the type of support and connections that our campers really need, even more then ever this year with all that is going on in the world. Then, later in the year, depending on what is possible to do, we hope to be able to put together some small group get-together's for our campers so that they have opportunities to see their friends in person.

Also, we are still hoping to hold our much loved Family Camp in person this year, in October, as guidelines allow. At Family Camp, families make connections with others who live near by, have children in similar age groups and understand the impact Type 1 diabetes has on the entire family.



This is an especially important program for families with children who have been recently diagnosed (and more are being diagnosed every day).

So despite all that is going on, it's still going to be a busy year at Camp Leo, and through these programs we believe we can continue to make a positive impact on the lives of the children and families who make up our camp community.

We appreciate the support of the Lions Club community, and your club, for our efforts. We do need the continued support of Lions this year to make sure we are able to provide this level of support to our kids and families. Like many non-profits, Camp Leo is facing the challenge of a significant drop in overall revenues this year, and we will need the continued support of Lions to continue to live up to our commitment to make our programs available to all who need them.

If your club is able, please consider making an additional donation to Camp Leo to help us with our new summer programs and for scholarships for our Family Camp in the Fall.

EASY GREEK SALAD

PREP TIME: 10 MIN COOK TIME: 10 MIN TOTAL TIME: 10 MIN SERVES 4



- ¼ cup extra-virgin olive oil
- 3 tablespoons red wine vinegar
- 1 garlic clove, minced
- ½ teaspoon dried oregano, more for sprinkling
- ¼ teaspoon Dijon mustard
- 1 English cucumber, cut lengthwise, seeded, and sliced ¼inch thick
- 1 green bell pepper, chopped into 1-inch pieces
- 2 cups halved cherry tomatoes
- 5 ounces feta cheese, cut into ½ inch cubes
- 1/3 cup thinly sliced red onion
- 1/3 cup pitted Kalamata olives
- 1/3 cup fresh mint leaves
- ¼ teaspoon sea salt
- Freshly ground black pepper.

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. In a small bowl, whisk together the olive oil, vinegar, garlic, oregano, mustard, salt, and several grinds of pepper.
- 2.On a large platter, arrange the cucumber, green pepper, cherry tomatoes, feta cheese, red onions, and olives. Drizzle with the dressing and very gently toss. Sprinkle with a few generous pinches of oregano and top with the mint leaves. Season to taste and serve.
