


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Fall is here - Spooky Time!

A Letter from the President


Ann Fowler - Club President

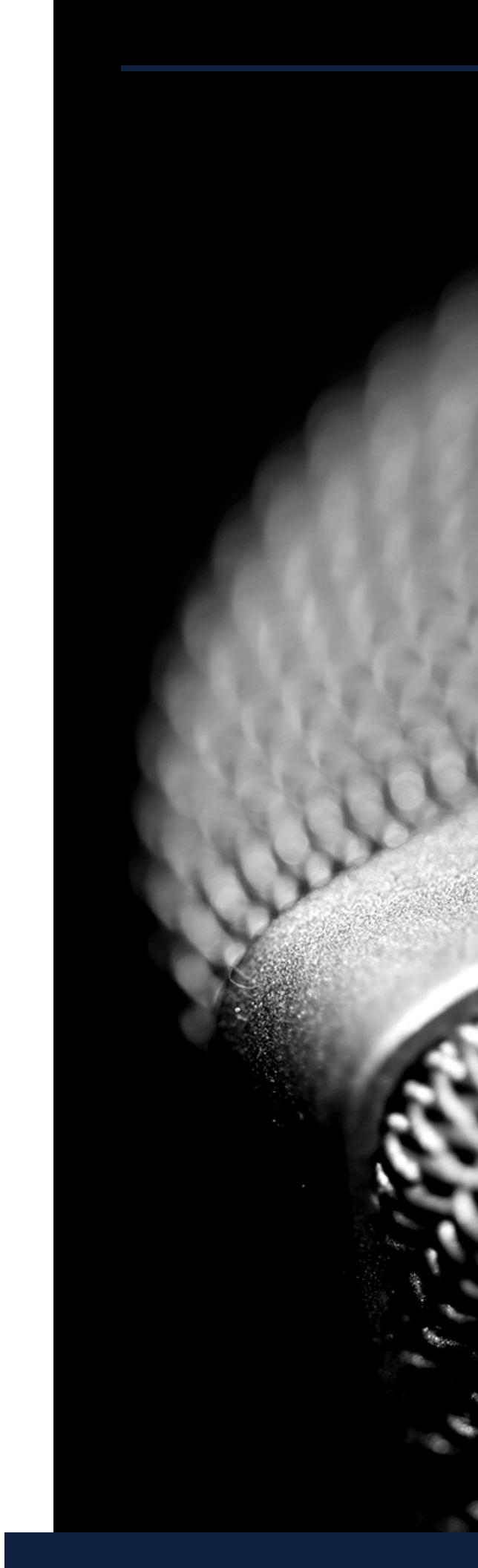

Recipe of the Month

SLOW COOKER POTATO SOUP

INGREDIENTS

- 2 pounds russet potatoes (about 8 medium), peeled and diced
- 2 pound Yukon gold potatoes, peeled and diced
- 4 ounces pancetta, cubed
- 1 small onion, diced
- 4 cloves garlic, chopped
- 2 quarts low-sodium chicken or vegetable broth
- 1 teaspoon kosher salt, plus more as needed
- 1/2 teaspoon dried thyme
- 1/4 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper, plus more as needed
- 1 (12-ounce) can evaporated milk
- 1/4 cup all-purpose flour

INSTRUCTIONS

1. **Preheat the slow cooker on LOW.** Before you begin peeling and chopping the vegetables, preheat a 6-quart or larger slow cooker on the LOW setting. This will help jump-start the cooking process.
2. **Pile the vegetables into the slow cooker.** Place the potatoes, pancetta, onion, and garlic in the slow cooker.
3. **Add the broth.** Pour in the broth. Give the mixture a stir to combine.
4. **Season and cook for 3 to 4 hours on HIGH, or 6 to 8 on LOW.** Add the salt, thyme, and pepper and stir to combine. Cover and cook until the potatoes and onions are tender, 3 to 4 hours on the HIGH setting or 6 to 8 hours on the LOW setting.
5. **Thirty minutes before serving, thicken the soup.** Before thickening the soup, taste and add more salt and pepper as needed. Whisk together the evaporated milk and flour in a small pitcher or measuring cup. Add pour this slurry into the soup and stir to combine. Cover and cook until the soup thickens, about 30 minutes more.
6. **Serving and holding the soup.** Serve the soup with the topping options. If not serving immediately, turn your slow cooker to the warm setting for up to 1 1/2 hours. As the soup cools, some separation might occur, but it's nothing a stir won't remedy.
